NARRATIVE

On 6/18/16 at 0409 hours I, Ofc Riffel #75, while on duty in the Village of Mt Pleasant, was dispatched to [REDACTED] for a call of a civil trouble. Upon arrival, I buzzed apartment [REDACTED] and LAQUISHA BOOKER came running down the stairs with a small child in her arms. She was frantic and angry and was immediately yelling very loudly. Initially, she would not calm down. She stated that JACOB BLAKE is inside the apartment and during the argument he made her drop her child. She gave me permission to enter the apartment. Upon entering, BLAKE was calmly standing in the kitchen with a 2 year old boy. BLAKE stated that he did not hit her as she was accusing and he stated that she is the one who has been out of control. BLAKE stated that BOOKER is angry because he will not give her the password to his cell phone. She suspects him of being unfaithful. I assisted as the lead officers gathered information from both parties. BLAKE admitted to having a few alcoholic drinks earlier in the night before he arrived home. Once outside, I had BLAKE blow into a PBT and it came back at a 0.06. Based on BLAKE admitting that he had consumed alcoholic beverages and the positive result of the PBT, BLAKE was eventually taken into custody for violating his bond which has a no drink order.

I have no further information at this time. This case was closed with an arrest.

NARRATIVE

On 6/18/16 at 0409 I, Ofc. Van Schyndel, along with Ofcs. Patek and Riffel was dispatched to [REDACTED] for a report of a domestic incident where a female was reportedly struck by a male.

We arrived and could hear a female yelling at someone from a second floor window. Ofc. Riffel pressed the buzzer and we were let in by the complainant, LAQUISHA BOOKER, who was the yelling female. BOOKER was holding a small male child in her arms and yelling very loudly.

She directed us towards [REDACTED] where a male, JACOB BLAKE was standing and holding another small child. BOOKER was loudly yelling and at BLAKE accusing him of hitting her. Ofc. Patek and I repeatedly told BOOKER to stop yelling at BLAKE and to quiet down as she was in the hallway of the apartment building and was disturbing the other residents. BOOKER did not quiet at all and continued yelling. We then separated them by closing the apartment door with BOOKER outside and BLAKE inside.

BLAKE briefly told me he had not struck BOOKER and that she had attacked him because she wanted to look at his phone and he would not unlock it for her. He said he was struck in the eye and that he was having a hard time seeing. I checked and could not see any markings on his face or by his eye and his eye

responded normally to the light of my flashlight and movement.

I then spoke with BOOKER who was still yelling at me about BLAKE. I again asked her to quiet her voice and she became angry at me for asking. She yelled that BLAKE had punched the left side of her face and upper chest. She pointed to her face and chest and I could not see any markings on her face. She was wearing a string tank top and I could see the part of her chest and shoulder she said was hit and I could not see any markings there either. BLAKE and BOOKER have two children in common making this a domestic abuse incident. BOOKER was yelling that she would press charges. She did not give consent to be struck. BOOKER then sat down on the steps to calm down as she only became louder and more agitated as I spoke to her.

I entered the apartment again and spoke to Ofc. Patek. We agreed that since BOOKER and BLAKE both accused the other and there was no clear evidence pointing either way, we would separate them and forward charges to the District Attorney's Office.

BLAKE said he would leave and gathered his clothes and a toothbrush. He also collected keys to a Chevy Caprice which BOOKER said belonged to her. I found the car in the lot and gave the plate () to dispatch. Dispatch confirmed that the Caprice was registered to BOOKER. I then recovered the keys to the car and apartment and gave them to BOOKER. Ofc. Riffel also had BLAKE blow into a PBT and he blew a value of .06. We offered a ride to BLAKE but he declined and wanted to walk. BLAKE then left the scene.

BOOKER asked why BLAKE was not in custody and just leaving. I explained that there was no clear evidence supporting either of their stories and the matter would be reviewed by the District Attorney's Office. She then told me that BLAKE was out on bond and was not supposed to be drinking. I checked with dispatch and they confirmed that BLAKE was currently out on bond for Racine County Circuit Court Case 2015CF001391. That case involved four misdemeanors and one felony charge and he did have a no drink order. We located BLAKE in the Razor Sharp parking lot and placed him into custody for Bail Jumping due to the no drink order.

I returned to BOOKER'S apartment and told her that BLAKE was now in custody for violating his bond. She asked why he was not in custody for choking her. I told her she initially did not say she was choked but only struck in the face and chest. She showed me some bruising on her neck and told me he had choked her so hard she nearly passed out. I did see on the left side of her neck some bruising just below the jaw line and some on the right side about midway up the neck. Based on my training and experience these marks were consistent with being choked.

Because of the marks on her neck and the fact that she felt pain and experienced a loss of airway to the point of almost losing consciousness, I

had evidence to support an arrest of BLAKE. I advised Ofc. Patek and Ofc. Oertel by phone that I now had probable cause to arrest BLAKE for Strangulation, Battery and Disorderly Conduct in addition to the Bail Jumping. Ofc. Oertel transported BLAKE to the Racine County Jail.

I advised BOOKER that I needed to take photographs and go over paperwork with her. She told me she was willing to do so and would let me back in when I retrieved my camera. I returned to my patrol vehicle #129 to retrieve my camera, and completed the top of the domestic abuse worksheet and filled in this complaint number. I was in my vehicle gathering and filling out paperwork for maybe 3-5 minutes.

When I returned to BOOKER'S apartment, her attitude had changed and she was crying and would not let me enter. She said she wasn't feeling up to completing any paperwork and would come to the police department tomorrow to complete it. I encouraged her to do so now while everything was fresh in her head and she refused. I told her I just needed to take photos of her neck and she declined to let me in to take photos either. I explained the 72 hour no contact order and she also refused to sign the form one way or the other.

Due to her sudden change in attitude I asked her if anyone had called her while I was retrieving my camera and paperwork. I asked if anyone had threatened or discouraged her from pressing charges or cooperating further and she repeatedly said no. She denied me any entry into her apartment and refused all paperwork. She did take a victim's rights pamphlet with this complaint printed on it.

I cleared the scene and then heard Ofc. Oertel call on the radio that the jail staff had refused BLAKE because he would not blow into their PBT. They were advised that he had already blown a .06 for us and was being charged because of it. The jail staff still refused him and required him to be medically cleared.

I met Ofc. Oertel at the hospital where BLAKE was medically cleared without incident. I then transported him back to the Racine County Jail where he was turned over to deputies.

BLAKE was identified by an Illinois ID card and BOOKER was identified verbally and confirmed through RMS records.

BLAKE was held on the following charges 16C16993-1a for Strangulation, s.s. 940.235, 16C16993-1b for Disorderly Conduct/Domestic Abuse, s.s. 947.01, 16C16993-1c for Battery, s.s. 940.19(1), 16C16993-1d for Felony Bail Jumping, s.s. 946.49(1b), and 16C16993-1e-h for Misdemeanor Bail Jumping, s.s. 946.49(1a).
