

PROBABLE CAUSE AFFIDAVIT

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared Trooper Hampton Affiant, and upon duly being sworn, states under oath as follows: My name is Trooper Hampton; I am a certified peace officer for the Texas Department of Public Safety. I have good reason to believe that the above individual did then and there in DALLAS County, Texas commit the offense of Driving While Intoxicated- 1st Offense over .15 BAC, a violation of PENAL CODE 49.04, a Class A Misdemeanor. My belief is based upon the following facts and information furnished to me;


On 5/4/14 at approximately 1:25 am I, Trooper Hampton, was working regular patrol when I observed a vehicle traveling SB on the Dallas North Tollway north of Mockingbird lane. The vehicle was changing lanes erratically and could not maintain the lane in which it was traveling in. The vehicle was stopped for not signaling a lane change. The driver continued to show erratic driving behaviors and took the Wycliff Ave. exit ramp. The driver came to a stop on Wycliff Ave. and refused to pull into a parking when instructed to do so. I made a passenger side approach and upon contact with the driver, I noticed signs of intoxication due to his red, bloodshot, droopy eyes and glazed look upon his face as well as the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. Barrientes refused to talk or answer questions. When asked if he had been drinking, he shook his head yes as well as shaking his head yes to having consumed at least 4 beers and a couple shots. Barrientes stated he drank from about 10p-1a. Barrientes was instructed on how to perform the SFSTs and was too intoxicated to conduct the HGN test but swayed in a circular manner during the test. Barrientes attempted the other two tests and displayed signs that are consistent with intoxication. Barrientes provided a roadside breath test which resulted in a .304 breath sample. Barrientes was arrested and while being searched incident to arrest, I located three 5mg tablets of hydrocodone in his front left jean pocket for which he did not have a prescription. The total weight of the pills came to 2.2 grams. Barrientes was read the DIC-24 and consented to providing a breath specimen. He was transported to the Dallas Co. Jail where a breath specimen was provided on the Intoxilyzer 5000 instrument and the results showed a .218/.220 alcohol concentration. Barrientes was released to the Dallas Co. Jail for processing.

The facts and sources of information upon which I say the above allegations are true. The facts contained herein are true and correct.
