Summary

On 04/24/21 at 1231 hours I was dispatched for an after-the-fact disturbance with a weapon located at PII. The reporting party was identified as Personal Identifying Information - Per stated that P recent PII with whom they used to live together identified as Megan A. Monroe Birthdates - ID showed up at P house uninvited and began speaking about their failed relationship. Eventually Pers attempted to leave and Megan retrieved a firearm from her glove box in her vehicle. Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test) Pers feared for P life and felt trapped.

Megan took possession of Perso phone and Apple Watch so P could not call for help. Pers was able to talk with Megan and eventually convince her to put the firearm back in her car. Later on, Pers was able to convince Megan to go for a drive and they ended up at the Kwik trip on Green Valley Rd. Pers informed Megan that she needed to call her parents to pick her up and get help or P would speak to the cashier and call the police. Megan did call her parents and they arrived to pick her up Medical (HIPPA) Pers did not receive a phone call the following morning and was convinced by P father to contact the Sheriff's Office to report this incident. Contact was made with Megan and a firearm was retrieved and she was arrested for Domestic False Imprisonment statute 940.30, Domestic Reckless Endangering Safety statute 941.30(1) and Domestic Disorderly Conduct statute 947.01(1) and should be considered for an enhancer of use with a

dangerous weapon statute 939.63(1)(d). Megan was booked into the Winnebago County Jail after obtaining medical clearance.

The firearm which was described was retrieved and entered into evidence. A domestic packet was completed with [Pers] and a written statement was obtained. The 72 hour no contact was enforced. A no bond statute was invoked. [Protecting

On 04/24/2021 at 1231 hours I was dispatched to [PII] for an after the fact disturbance with a weapon involved. I was informed that [PII] Megan Monroe had showed up the prior day and threatened to shoot [Pe] and herself if [Pe] called the police. The reporting party was able to talk Megan into taking a drive with [Pe] to Kwik Trip where [Pe] said [Pe] was going to call the police or Megan's parents. [Medical

I arrived at the address of [PII] and met with the reporting party, [Personal Identifying Information - Victims Pers] was very emotional and crying and sobbing throughout our contact while initially informing me what happened. It did appear that while [Pe] was telling me what happened [Pe] was fearful of the suspect and was not confrontational with [Pe]. In the residence was [Person] father as well, who convinced [Pe] to call the police and report this incident. [Pers] informed me that [Personal] [Personal] whom [Pe] identified as Megan A. Monroe [Birthdates - ID] showed up to [Pe] house the previous day on 04/23/2021 around 1500 hours against [Pe] wishes. [Pe] said [Pe] was trying to come over in the morning and [Pe] said no. Megan showed up unannounced and they spoke in the driveway for a couple hours about how [Pe] was doing and that [Pe] is getting therapy to get past their recent break up. [Pers] asked Megan to leave many times and she refused. [Pers] said that [Pe] had to leave and got in [Pe] car to leave. [Pers] started to back out of [Pe] garage in [Pe] vehicle and Megan was on the passenger side of [Pe] car. Megan opened the passenger side door of her car and retrieved a firearm from the glovebox.

[Pers] stated that Megan walked up to [Pe] vehicle and told [Pe] to get out. [Pe] said she pointed the firearm at [Pe] and took [Pe] phone and Apple watch. [Pe] said that [Pe] felt threatened for [Pe] life and Megan told [Pe] not to do anything stupid or she would shoot [Pe]. [Pers] stated that they talked for a long time about their failed relationship and [Pe] was able to convince Megan to put the firearm back into her car and drive to Kwik Trip. When they were at Kwik Trip, [Pers] told Megan that she needed to call her parents to pick her up or [Pe] would go to the cashier and ask them to call the police. Megan was picked up by her parents [Medical (HIPPA)

[Medical] Megan's father also informed [Pers] that he would dispose of the firearm. Deputy Putzer W30 was asked to go to the Kwik Trip on Green Valley Rd. to review video to corroborate Emily's story and he did confirm that they arrived around midnight, as [Pers] stated. Deputy Vinje W48 spoke with the neighbor to the north as [Pers] stated [Pe] was outside when Megan arrived to see if he saw anything. The neighbor did not want to get involved.

[Pers] described the firearm as gray in color about 5 or 6 inches long. [Pe] thought it was real and feared for [Pe] life. Deputy Vinje W48, Deputy Rippl W46 and Lt. Dalle Nogare W18 arrived on scene and were en route to Megan's parent's residence to make contact with her regarding this incident. [Protecting Public Safety and Investigations]

[Personal Identifying Information - Victims] Megan and [Pers] lived together for a long period of time and recently broke up. It should be noted that [Pers] was sobbing and had tears in [Pe] eyes many times while explaining to me what happened while gathering a written statement. I was able to obtain the following written statement from [Pers].

"On 04/23/21 at about 1500 I was outside doing yard work. [Personal Identifying Information] Megan Monroe kept asking to come over. I told her no. She was persistent and kept asking and she stopped by. We were outside when she arrived. We talked for about an hour or 2 outside in the driveway. [Personal Identifying Information - Victims] Conversation went south when she started questioning me if I started seeing other people and who I was hanging out with. I was starting to feel uncomfortable and said I have to leave to get gas. Megan started crying and wanted to come with me. She said she would have made other plans if she knew she was going to ditch me. I told her to get out of the garage and asked her to leave about 15-20 times. I was able to get into my car and started to back up and she had her passenger side door open so I had to stop. Megan grabbed a gun out of her glove compartment. It was dark gray about 5" long I thought it was loaded and it was real. [Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test)] She told me to shut the car off and get out. I did. [Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test)]

[Personal Identifying Information - Victims] She made me give her my cell phone and Apple watch. When she said don't touch your phone she had the gun pointed at me. I gave her the phone and apple watch she then brought the gun back to her chest or in her front sweatshirt pocket. She had her hand on it the whole time. [Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test)] She asked to go into the garage. I spent a lot of time trying to talk to her and tell her it's going to be okay. She started to calm down I asked a couple times for her to put the gun in the glove box and eventually she did. [Pr]

[Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test)] She eventually agreed to go for a drive to calm down more and get a drink. The gun was in her car and we took my car a 2011 gray Dodge charger. I drove and she still had my phone and apple watch which was in her car. Many times while we were talking when she had the gun and when she didn't I asked to leave and wanted to leave. She said no I know what you're going to do. Prior to us leaving I had to go to the bathroom she had to stand there in the doorway while I went so I couldn't try anything. I felt that leaving was the best choice. I had no phone and felt like I was trapped. I was thinking of a way to get out of this and going for a ride was the best idea I had. I drove to the Kwik trip on Green Valley Rd. I felt that if I tried to do anything while driving she would have grabbed the steering wheel. We went to the far Kwik trip because she had to finish smoking. She said you better not drive erratic or anything to get us pulled over. I pulled up to the pumps and paid for gas at the pumps. She was standing by me the whole time. We went inside to get our drinks. We walked to the drink cooler and I told her we are both in a very unfortunate situation so either she calls her parents [Protecting Public] or I would asked the cashier to use their phone to call the police. She got a little upset saying I tricked her. We went outside back to the car and she made me shut the door in the car. I told her to call. She said she wanted a cigarette pull up to the front. I said that she needs to call in the next five minutes or I was going to go inside. She then called her parents. Her parents showed eventually it was agreed we would return to my house. Megan didn't want to

give me my phone back but her mom convinced her to. We got back to my house. Everybody left. [Redacted] Medical

When every one left I called my dad and told him what happened. [Redacted] Medical (HIPPA)

I provided the statement as written to [Redacted] Pers to make any changes if [Redacted] Pe wished to and [Redacted] Pe did not and signed it.

[Redacted] Protecting Based on the information provided at this time it was decided that Megan would be arrested for False Imprisonment statute 940.30 and Reckless Endangering Safety statute 941.30(1) and Disorderly Conduct statute 947.01(1) all domestic charges and should be considered for an enhancer of using a dangerous weapon statute 939.63(1)(d). There was also a no bond invoked on the booking form.

I met with the store manager at Kwik Trip on Green Valley Rd. and he was able to turn over CCTV footage on 2 different CD's of Megan and [Redacted] Pers while at the store to corroborate [Redacted] Person statement. The video showed them going to the pumps, paying at the pumps for gas and entering the store around 1150 hours on 04/23/21. They stand and talk in the store for a period of time by the coolers. While at the store Megan does not let there be much distance between her and [Redacted] Pers. They then exit the store and pull up in the front parking area by the main doors and you can see Megan in the passenger side of the vehicle smoking a cigarette. Around 0100 hours on 04/24/21 you can see two individuals show up to the north side on the vehicle speaking with Megan in the passenger side, most likely Megan's parents. Deputies were dispatched to [REDACTED] PII Winnebago County Wisconsin for an after-the-fact disturbance with a weapon. Our initial dispatch information was Megan A. Monroe [REDACTED] Birthdates - ID Protection pointed a handgun at [REDACTED] Personal Identifying Information - Victims on 04/23/2021. I acknowledged the call and responded to the above location along with Deputy Gende W32.

Upon my arrival Deputy Gende was already speaking with [REDACTED] Pers about the situation. Based on the information learned I was aware of the fact Megan had been picked up by her parents during the incident and that the firearm in question had possibly been thrown out by Megan's father.

It was determined myself, Deputy Rippl W46, and Lieutenant Dalle Nogare W18 would respond to Megan's parent's house in the [REDACTED] PII where it was believed Megan resided as well. We responded to [REDACTED] PII Dakota Lee Way in the City of Omro Winnebago County Wisconsin to locate Megan. We wanted to [REDACTED] Medical (HIPPA) take her into custody for the incident.

As I was approaching the driveway to Megan's residence I saw her standing outside in the driveway. I exited my squad car and asked Megan to keep her hands up and asked if she had any weapons to which she stated no. [REDACTED] Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test) [REDACTED] Protecting Public Safety and [REDACTED] I searched Megan and did not locate any weapons.

I spoke with Megan's father about the firearm. I asked him to turn it over so we could avoid having to utilize a search warrant. Megan's father stated that he had disassembled the firearm and hid it in the garage. He gave me a yellow festival bag which contained a 40 caliber Smith & Wesson silver and black in color. The firearm had a serial number of his the [REDACTED] PII. Megan's father went on to explain that when he located the firearm it was not loaded however there was ammunition with it.

On Saturday, April 24, 2021 at 1231 hours, I Deputy J. Rippl W46 heard Deputy Vinje and Deputy Gende get dispatched to an after-the-fact disturbance complaint on [PII] in Winnebago County. A short time later Deputy Vinje requested my assistance at the call. I responded to the [PII] address where I made contact with Deputy Vinje. Deputy Vinje briefed me on the incident and requested that I attempt to make contact at the neighbor's residence.

Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test)

I was advised by Deputy Vinje that the suspect in the incident resided with her parents at [PII] Dakota Lee Way in the city of Omro. Deputy Vinje advised that I should accompany him to that address. We were also accompanied by Lt. Dalle Nogare.

Upon arrival at [PII] Dakota Lee Way in the city of Omro Deputy Vinje made contact with the female suspect in the incident Megan A. Monroe. Lt. Dalle Nogare advised me to bring a transport belt to the location where he and Deputy Vinje were speaking to Megan Monroe. I retrieved a transport belt and myself and Lt. Dalle Nogare placed Megan Monroe into handcuffs. These handcuffs were placed on her wrists checked for tightness and safety locked. She was then secured with the transport belt. It should be noted that Deputy Vinje had searched Monroe prior to me placing her in the transport belt. [Medical]

Just after leaving the residence I was requested by Deputy Vinje to retrieve an Apple Watch that belonged to the victim in the incident from Megan Monroe's vehicle. Megan Monroe advised me that the Apple Watch was likely on the floorboard of the vehicle and gave me permission to go into the vehicle and retrieve the watch. I made contact with Megan Monroe's father, who unlocked the vehicle for me and assisted me in locating the watch. I located the watch on the passenger side floor between the seat and the door. I turned the watch over to Lt. Dalle Nogare, who transported it to the victim's residence.

I then escorted Megan Monroe back to my patrol car and transported her to the Winnebago County jail. Megan Monroe was booked into the Winnebago County jail on Disorderly Conduct, False Imprisonment, Recklessly Endangering Safety with a Use of Dangerous Weapon enhancer and a no bond statute was also invoked.

After turning Monroe over to the Winnebago County jail, I cleared the scene.

I arrived at Kwik Trip convenience store 5821 Green Valley Rd Oshkosh, WI 54904 to assist Dep. Gende and Dep. Vinje on an investigation that they were working on.

Initial information provided in this case read that the reporting party stated that last night **Personal** Megan Monroe, came to **P** house and pulled out a gun. **Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance**  
**Protecting Public Safety and Investigations (Balance Test)** The reporting party was able to talk Megan into taking a drive with **P** and they went to Kwik Trip where **P** said **P** was calling the police or Megan's parents. The information provided read that they ended up calling Megan's parents.

Medical (HIPPA)

Deputy Vinje asked that I travel to the Kwik Trip convenience store at 5821 Green Valley Rd., Oshkosh, WI 54904 and attempt to gather video surveillance of the reporting party and Megan Monroe at the Kwik trip convenience store. Deputy Vinje said that from the information he had gathered, the two subjects would have been at the Kwik Trip convenience store at or about 12:00 AM on 04-24-2021.

It was found that the reporting party in this case was an **Personal Identifying Information -** and Megan Monroe was a Megan A. Monroe **Birthdates - ID**. Prior to responding to the Kwik Trip convenience store, I found photographs of both individuals to assist me in isolating the surveillance video footage at the Kwik Trip convenience store. Deputy Vinje had told me that the two subjects would be arriving at the Kwik trip convenience store in a gray Dodge Charger.

I met with Kwik Trip assistant manager Patty M. Patty M. and I viewed the video footage at the Kwik Trip convenience store 5821 Green Valley Rd., Oshkosh, WI 54904. We began our review of the video surveillance footage starting at 11:00 PM on 04-23-2021. At 11:50 PM, we could see in the video surveillance a gray Dodge charger driving into the convenience store gas pump area and it parked adjacent to pump #7 (on the north side of the pump). The vehicle was facing in a northbound direction. We were able to view the license plate on the vehicle, the license plate being **PII** This license plate returned to a 2011 Dodge Charger gray in color to an **Personal Identifying Information - PII**

PII [REDACTED] From a different camera view (the front door view) were able to see two individuals enter the Kwik trip convenience store. The two individuals appeared that they may be Pers [REDACTED] and Megan Monroe. Pers [REDACTED] appeared to be wearing blue jeans and a black jacket, Monroe appeared to be wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt with the hood up and black pants. Monroe appeared to be wearing glasses.

Using different camera angles we were able to view the two individuals enter the Kwik trip convenience store, walk toward the refrigerators where beverages are kept, and then exit the store without making a purchase. The two individuals walked back to the gray Dodge Charger. It appeared that Monroe entered the passenger seat of the Charger. The Dodge Charger then drove away from pump #7. Patty said that she does not have the training to make a permanent disk copy of this video surveillance. She said that if I return on 04-25-2021 between the hours of 5:00 AM and 2:00 PM I could meet with assistant manager Kevin Z. Patty said that Kevin is trained in making disk copies of the video surveillance.

04/24/2021 1419 HOURS DEP. D. PUTZER W30

I arrived at the Winnebago County Sheriff's Office evidence room 4311 Jackson St., Oshkosh, WI 54901. I had overheard that Deputy Vinje was at this location reference this incident. I informed Deputy Vinje that the Kwik trip convenience store did in fact have video surveillance of the gray Dodge Charger arriving at the Kwik trip convenience store. I told him that the Kwik Trip convenience store would be able to make a copy of the video surveillance on 04-25-2021.

Deputy Vinje was placing items into evidence reference this incident. One of the items was a disassembled automatic pistol that was in a yellow plastic bag. To assist Deputy Vinje, I equipped myself with the Winnebago County Sheriff's Office department issued digital camera. I gathered photographs of the disassembled automatic pistol while still in the bag it was contained in. With gloved hands, I removed the pistol parts and gathered photographs of them while laying on a clean sheet of white paper. The handgun appeared to be a disassembled 40 caliber Smith & Wesson model SD40 VE with the serial number of FZC0634. This handgun had a silver colored metallic upper slide and a plastic polymer type lower receiver. Included with this firearm was a empty 14 round magazine. In addition, there was a small box possibly containing 20 rounds of Browning X-Point Defense .147 grain 9 mm cartridges. The small box had 1 of the end covers torn off of it. Photographs were gathered of these items.

To further assist Deputy Vinje, I packaged these pistol parts into a handgun evidence box using nylon type tie straps. This was done while wearing nitrile gloves. Deputy Vinje and I then sealed the box using red evidence tape. I watched as Deputy Vinje labeled the box and initialed the evidence seals. I then departed this location.

04/25/2021 0712 HOURS DEP. D. PUTZER W30

I arrived at the Kwik Trip convenience store 5821 Green Valley Rd., Oshkosh, WI 54904 where I met with assistant manager Kevin Z. I explained to Kevin that I had met with assistant manager Patty M. on 04-24-2021 regarding having a disk made of surveillance video footage regarding this incident. I provided Kevin with the information regarding the dates and times specified of when the video footage would need to be recorded. Kevin said that he would make a disk based upon this information and that it would be available at about 11:00 AM on this date.

Deputy Gende had contacted me referencing me gathering this disk of video footage. Gende advised that there may be additional video footage at the Kwik Trip convenience store after **Pers** and Monroe left or drove away from pump #7. Gende said that they may have re-parked the Dodge Charger at the front of the store. Gende stated that he would contact the Kwik Trip convenience store and advise them to add this possible additional video footage to the video footage disk.
